





Conquering Cold Sores

Playing in the snow at Walter Park

Many adults and children carry the virus that causes cold sores. Although the virus doesn't bother them most of the time, certain things like stress and illness trigger the virus and make it active. Each attack causes sores to form around the mouth or nose. They start as red, itchy patches that develop into patches that develop into blisters then open weepy sores. The sores form crusty scabs than then crack.

The virus is transmitted by saliva and spread by touching a cold sore, kissing or sharing cutlery, face cloths or towels with someone who has a cold sore.

Before the sores come out, a tingly sensation may be felt. This is the best time to treat a cold sore. Treatment may include creams such as Zovirax®, patches or a single dose of tablets called Famvir® available from the pharmacist. The Doctor can prescribe a longer course of tablets if cold sores are occurring frequently. Some vitamins such as Lysine may also help prevent cold sores, ask your pharmacy team for advice. 

Mairehau High School Senior Boys Basketball Team

Mairehau High School has a very proud history of Secondary School Basketball, with a total of twelve National titles during the latter part of the 1970's – bettered only by one other school in New Zealand. Over the past 6 years, we have been working tirelessly using basketball as a platform for success for many of our students.

Recently our Senior Boys Basketball team competed at the South Island premiership in Dunedin, achieving a long fought goal of putting our school back onto the Basketball map. Amazingly, our team won the "A" Premiership in the dying seconds of the final. This was an awesome result and one that the team and school is immensely proud of.

That in turn brought on the financial problem of how we could fund the team to the National Championships in Palmerston North. A meeting was organized with Brendon Burns, our local Labour MP, and Peter Gamble of the Christchurch Lions Association. Brendon and Peter arrived at one of the team's practices and were able to deliver some fantastic news – Brendon

had approached the Canterbury Earthquake Recovery Trust and the Wilding Foundation to get some funding for the team and the Lions Club also came to the rescue with a significant donation. Another generous contribution has come from the Soroptimist International Group of Christchurch.

The Mairehau Legends are now heading north to represent Mairehau High School and the South Island at the National Championships.

Mr Burns enjoyed shooting a few hoops with the boys. 'This is a low decile school in an area which has been hard-hit by the recent quakes. The Legends success is tribute to some real focus and hard work. Such successes are very important to our community at this time'. Brendon also thanked the Legends coach, Mairehau High Schools Deputy Principal Kaylib Gorrie, who leads the boys through early morning training sessions three times a week.

Mr Gorrie says, 'Going north will undoubtedly be a life altering opportunity for all of the team, a chance to positively affect these young men – role models to so many at our school. To our generous sponsors, thank you for your support, ensuring our students can continue to fulfill their basketball dreams'.
